Introduction

Over the past few decades, the world has made remarkable progress towards the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. However, the Global Sustainable Development Report 2023, asserts that many countries are struggling to rebuild in the aftermath of the Covid-19 pandemic, the associated challenges brought about the Russia-Ukraine crisis and the current spiraling world inflation.

Africa's development is threatened by the challenges mentioned above in addition to the persistence and deepening of climate change, food insecurity, unemployment and conflicts etc. The rapidly rising global interest rates and the absence of a well-functioning framework for comprehensive debt reduction and relief threaten to cut access to international financial markets for many countries in Africa¹. According to IMF 2023, growth in sub-Saharan Africa will decline to 3.6 percent in 2023. Amid a global slowdown, activity is expected to decelerate for a second year in a row. Still, this headline figure masks significant variations across the region. The funding squeeze will also impact the region's longer-term outlook. A shortage of funding may force countries to reduce resources for critical development sectors like health, education, and infrastructure, weakening the region's growth potential².

Africa needs coordinated policy changes and sustained action to increase food production, improve distribution, ensure affordability, reduce dependency, and act green—for it to spur its growth. Full operationalization of the AfCFTA to facilitate the free movement of labor, inputs, and food across the Africa market, shift from food supply to developing resilient food systems, innovation and environmental sustainability are some of the critical issues that needs to be looked at keenly through such models as cooperatives that embody and are crucial partners in achieving sustainability.

In this context, practical solutions that can accelerate progress on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Agenda 2063 will be urgently needed. In this regard, we would like to demonstrate the contribution of cooperatives in advancing the achievement of the SDGs and the Agenda 2063 in Africa. As natural vehicles of collaborative partnership and prosperity for all, cooperatives contribute to economic, social, and environmental sustainability across regions and economic sectors. It is inherent among them to safeguard community relations, enhance local resources, advocate social responsibility, and adopt sustainable and long-term business practices.
