The establishment of this sub-regional office stands as a monumental achievement, symbolising a commitment to enhancing our presence, visibility, and impact in Southern Africa. May saw the hosting of the 10th Technical Committee of the Africa **Ministerial** (TCAMCCO) Cooperative Conference brought together which government representatives, co-operative leaders. stakeholders under the Transforming Cooperatives for a Stronger Discussions Africa. centred reimagining the co-operative identity and sustaining co-operation through networks, trade, partnerships, financial inclusion, and professionalism.

Our participation in international forums, such as the ACP-EU follow-up committee meetings and the Global Social and Solidarity Economy Forum (GSEF). showcased the global relevance and impact of the African co-operative movement. platforms not only facilitated dialogue but also positioned African operatives as crucial contributors to global economic and social agendas.

PROMOTING MEANINGFUL YOUTH PARTICIPATION AND EMPOWERMENT IN EU EXTERNAL ACTION FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



The European Economic and Social Committee (EESC) held the ACP-EU Follow-Up Committee meeting on January 12-13 in Brussels with representation from ICA-Africa. This committee serves as a vital platform for promoting cooperation between ACP (African, Caribbean, and Pacific) countries and the EU, line with the Cotonou in Partnership Agreement.

During the meeting, participants engaged in meaningful debates about the contribution that the ACP region has on the Youth Action Plan in EU external action, reflections on the future activities in the Indo-Pacific region and the latest developments and participation of civil society in the economic partnership agreement.

ICA-Africa signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Government of Botswanag for hosting the new ICA-Africa Southern Africa office.



PROGRESS ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF MODEL LAW ON COOPERATIVES FOR AFRICA



As a follow up to the Resolution adopted by the Pan-African Parliament to develop a model law on cooperatives in Africa, Dr. Chiyoge Sifa, the Regional Director of ICA-Africa presented the draft model law to the Committee on Monetary and Financial Affairs.

The Model Laws will address the financing gap particularly for Small and Medium-Size Enterprises (SMEs) by advancing the implementation of the Africa Continental Free Trade Agreement for Africa's structural transformation.

April

UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY ADOPTS THE FIRST RESOLUTION ON THE SOCIAL AND SOLIDARITY ECONOMY



The United Nations adopted its first-ever resolution on promoting the social and solidarity economy (SSE) for sustainable development during the General Assembly on April 18, 2023. The resolution recognizes cooperatives as part of the SSE and member states to promote and encourages implement strategies, policies, and programs for and enhancing the SSE supporting dedicated legal frameworks, national statistics, fiscal and public procurement incentives, education curricula. and capacity-building and research initiatives.

The Global Social and Solidarity Economy Forum (GSEF) made history as the first-ever forum of its kind to be held in Dakar, Senegal from May 1st-6th, 2023. The forum explored the theme '"Transitioning informal from economies collective and sustainable economies for our territories". Elected representatives, leaders, and experts from around the world came together to promote this new economy grounded in respect for humans and the environment. The forum facilitated the sharing of experiences and expertise to enable the extension of successful innovations led by local governments stakeholders in the social and solidarity economy.

June

43RD SESSION OF THE ACP-EU JOINT PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY



43rd Session the ACP-EU The οf Joint Parliamentary Assembly was held in Brussels, Belgium from 24th to 28th June 2023, with key debates covering critical raw materials, hybrid threats, and UN Security Council reform. Dr. Chiyoge Sifa, the Regional Director of ICA-Africa, representing cooperatives, delivered a speech emphasizing the importance of engaging economic civil society in partnership agreements and the EU Global Initiative. 8TH EU-AFRICA ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL SHAREHOLDERS' NETWORK



The European Economic and Social Committee held its 8th EU-Africa Economic and Social Shareholders' Network on the 28th-29th, June 2023 in Brussels. The event brought together representatives from organized civil society, including employers, trade unions, cooperatives, farmers' organizations, consumer groups, and NGOs from both continents.

Titled "The AU-EU Partnership for a Sustainable Future," the meeting focused on various topics such as the involvement of economic and social partners in the post-Cotonou agreement, the mid-term review of EU financing instruments for external action, water and nutrition in relation to the Zero Hunger objective and water sustainability, and the mutually beneficial partnership for sustainable development regarding critical raw materials.

THE COOPERATIVE BUSINESS MODEL FOR SOCIO-ECONOMIC TRANSFORMATION



The Co-operative University of Kenya (CUK) hosted Kenya's first Cooperative Movement Stakeholders' Conference, emphasizing the role of cooperatives and MSMEs in driving socio-economic transformation aligned with the government's Bottom-Up Economic Transformation Agenda (BETA). Themed "Cooperative Model for Socio-Economic Transformation," the conference sought to align stakeholders with BETA goals and build awareness of the opportunities and responsibilities it entails.

Dr. Chiyoge Sifa represented ICA-Africa, discussing the expansion of cooperative development in East and Central Africa and emphasizing growth potential in cross-border cooperative activities, especially in financial services.

CONSULTATIONS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A MODEL LAW ON COOPERATIVES IN AFRICA



The Permanent Committee on Monetary and Financial Affairs of the Pan-African Parliament in collaboration with the International Cooperative Alliance-Africa (ICA-Africa) held consultations on the Draft Model Law on Cooperatives for Africa in Nairobi, Kenya, on August 29th and 30th, 2023. The consultations marked a pivotal moment in shaping the continent's cooperative landscape. Regional stakeholders came together to share valuable insights and proposals, culminating in a Final Communique that outlines the outcomes of their collaborative efforts.

BOOSTING THE AGRICULTURAL LANDSCAPE IN AFRICA: FINANCING FOR FARMER ORGANIZATIONS



In a significant stride towards bolstering the agricultural landscape in Africa, Musa Sibandze, Chairperson of the Alliance Africa Agricultural Cooperative Organisation (AAACO), represented farmer organizations and ICA-Africa at the Africa Food System Forum (AGRF) Side Event. The event aimed to find ways to help African farmers' organizations (FOs) secure financial support for their agricultural projects, especially given recent challenges like the COVID-19 pandemic, the Ukraine crisis, and climate change.

September

November

COOPERATIVES FOR A SUSTAINABLE TRANSFORMATION IN AFRICA (COOPSTAR)




The Cooperatives for a Sustainable Transformation in Africa (CoopStar) workshop - held in Nairobi, Kenya, from 3-6 December marked a crucial step forward in the journey towards establishing a project that will support the African cooperative movement to play a key role in the transition towards a circular, green and sustainable economy in the light of the UN Agenda 2030 and to boost sustainable cooperative entrepreneurship in Africa.

Supported by the International Cooperative Alliance, International Alliance-Africa, Cooperative the International Labor Organization, the Korean Federation of Community Credit Unions (KFCC), Cera/BRS, and KU Leuven, the CoopStar initiative brought together experts from 18 African countries to lay the foundation for the book project on the role of cooperatives in transitioning to a circular, green, and sustainable economy,
