# THE YEAR IN BRIEF

2024 was a pivotal year for ICA-Africa, marked by renewed advocacy, strategic partnerships, and vibrant youth engagement that set a strong foundation for the 2025 International Year of Cooperatives. The year's main highlight was the Midterm Review of the 13th Africa Ministerial Cooperative Conference, held virtually under the theme "Leveraging Cooperatives for Transitioning African Economies: A Holistic Approach to Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation, Peace and Security, and Economic Stability."

Governance and membership saw significant growth as ICA-Africa welcomed new organizations, including Union des Mutuelles Financières de Développement (MUFID UNION) from Cameroon, Fédération Nationale des Unions Régionales des Sociétés Coopératives des Producteurs de la Filière Anacarde (COOP-CA) from Côte d'Ivoire, Amigos Savings & Credit Cooperative (Amigos SACCO) from Ethiopia, and Uganda Health Partners Cooperative Limited (UPHC) from Uganda. With these additions, ICA-Africa's membership now stands at 44 organizations across 23 countries, representing 37% of the continent. During the 17th ICA-Africa Regional Assembly, held at the ICA Global Conference in New Delhi, India, Mr. Macloud Malonza was unanimously elected Vice President of the ICA-Africa Regional Board.

Policy and legal affairs advanced significantly with the adoption of the Model Law on Cooperatives by the Pan-African Parliament, a key advocacy tool for cooperative legislation across Africa. ICA-Africa also collaborated with the African Union Commission, Pan-African Parliament, ILO, and ICA to launch the African Cooperatives Centre, which promotes the Social Solidarity Economy, enhances social protection, and creates decent jobs. The organization represented the African cooperative movement in key global forums, including the UN Civil Society Conference in Nairobi, contributing to preparations for the UN Summit of the Future and the Africa Regional Policy Forum on Development, where ICA-Africa moderated a session and supported member participation from Mozambique and DRC to advocate for inclusive EU-Africa cooperation, and the European Economic and Social Committee's plenary debate on democracy in Africa.

In terms of visibility and outreach, ICA-Africa partnered with TomorrowNow to host a webinar that sensitized agricultural cooperatives on the importance of weather intelligence, digital climate advisory, and capacity development. The ICA-Africa Gender Equality Committee organized a capacity-building forum that led to the development of the ICA Gender Equality Committee Action Plan 2025. Additionally, the Alliance Africa Agricultural Cooperative Organisation (AAACO) hosted a peer-to-peer learning webinar on December 5, bringing together 19 alumni of the ICA-MAFF training programme and AAACO members from 11 African countries to advance agricultural initiatives through knowledge sharing and collaboration. Youth engagement remained a strong pillar as the ICA-Africa Youth Network actively participated in high-level events. The Youth President and the Youth Executive Member-at-Large represented Africa at the International Forum of Consumer Cooperation in Russia, while a Youth Side Event at the Midterm Review of the 13th Africa Ministerial Cooperative Conference in Lesotho fostered leadership development among young cooperators.

ICA-Africa's achievements in 2024 reflect a year of robust advocacy, strengthened partnerships, and expanded youth and gender engagement. With 2025 declared the International Year of Cooperatives we're excited to build on this year's progress by continuing to support our members, advocating for cooperatives at every level, and building a more inclusive and sustainable cooperative movement in Africa.

### LEVERAGING COOPERATIVES FOR TRANSITIONING AFRICAN ECONOMIES



The Midterm Review of the 13th Africa Ministerial Cooperative Conference was held virtually on May 20th and 2024. The conference addressed the 21st, theme "Leveraging Cooperatives for Transitioning African Economies: A Holistic Approach to Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation, Peace and Security, and Economic Stability." Over the two days, participants from across the continent discussed strategies for utilizing the cooperative model to address critical issues facing African economies such as climate change, peace and security and economic stability. Cooperative experts and delegates shared insights and innovative approaches, emphasizing the importance of the cooperative model in fostering sustainable development in Africa.

# EMPOWERING AFRICAN YOUTH THROUGH THE COOPERATIVE BUSINESS MODEL



The International Cooperative Alliance-Africa hosted a Youth Side Event at the Midterm Review of the 13th Africa Ministerial Cooperative Conference on 19th May, 2024, in Maseru, Lesotho. The event, themed "Empowering African Youth through the Cooperative Business Model: Leadership and Entrepreneurship Development Workshop," aimed to foster and cultivate leadership among young cooperators. Participants delved into youth entrepreneurship by exploring best practices, including how to start cooperatives that address the needs of young people and other enterprise activities.

# COOPSTAR: EMPOWERING THE AFRICAN COOPERATIVE MOVEMENT AS A KEY PLAYER IN THE TRANSITION TOWARDS A CIRCULAR, GREEN, AND SUSTAINABLE ECONOMY



The International Cooperative Alliance-Africa in collaboration with The Ministry of Tourism, Handicrafts, and Social and Solidarity Economy and the Office of Cooperation Development (ODCO), successfully held the second CoopStar (Cooperatives for a Sustainable Transformation in Africa) Workshop in Rabat from May 26 to 28, 2024. Following the preliminary workshop held in Nairobi, Kenya, in December 2023, which brought together experts to lay the foundation for the book project on the role of cooperatives in transitioning to a circular, green, and sustainable economy, this event focused on finalizing the book chapters.

# AFRICAN UNION LAUNCHES AFRICAN COOPERATIVES CENTRE TO PROMOTE SOCIAL SOLIDARITY ECONOMY



The African Union has officially launched the African Cooperatives Centre (ACC), a key initiative aimed at advancing the Social Solidarity Economy (SSE) across Africa. Officially unveiled on September 27 at the Pan-African Parliament in Midrand, South Africa, the ACC will act as a hub for knowledge exchange, capacity building, training, and advocacy, enabling cooperatives and other SSE entities to collaboratively tackle social protection challenges across the continent. The United Nations officially launched the 2025 International Year of Cooperatives (IYC) at the ICA Global Cooperative Conference and General Assembly held in New Delhi, India. This historic event brought together over 3,000 participants, including cooperative leaders, UN representatives, and policymakers from more than 100 countries, to explore how cooperatives build prosperity for all. The discussions led to the adoption of the New Delhi Action Agenda, a call to action for cooperatives, governments, civil society, and global institutions to work together for a just society and a safer planet. In November and December 2024, India hosted two major youth events under the International Cooperative Alliance (ICA)—the Coopathon and the Youth Leadership Exchange Program (YLEP)—bringing together young cooperators from around the world to promote innovation, collaboration, and leadership. The meeting aimed to finalize the draft Model Law on Cooperative Societies for Africa by incorporating stakeholder inputs to ensure it reflects the needs and aspirations of the African people. The refined draft is set to be presented to the PAP Committee on Finance and Monetary Affairs.

# LAUNCH OF THE SECOND ICA-EU PARTNERSHIP ON INTERNATIONAL COOPERATIVE DEVELOPMENT #COOPS4dev



ICA and its regional teams convened in Brussels for a kick-off week marking the launch of the second phase of the ICA-EU Partnership on International Cooperative Development. Spanning four and a half years (April 2024 to September 2028), this programme aims to strengthen global cooperative the movement's contribution to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). During the kick-off meeting, colleagues received training, identified opportunities collaborate, and developed a common action plan for the partnership. The partnership will involve a range of activities, including capacity building, research and education, advocacy and partnerships, visibility and communications, and project management.

# REGIONAL PROGRAMME FOR COOPERATIVE DEVELOPMENT (REGCOOP PROJECT)



The Regional Programme for Cooperative Development (REGCOOP Project), a five-year initiative (2024-2028) under the Growing Resilience Programme, aims to enhance food security in Tanzania and Mozambique through the development of sustainable local value chains, with a strong emphasis on empowering women and strengthening the cooperative movement through research, advocacy, and capacity building. Funded by the Norwegian Agency for Development Cooperation (Norad) through Norges Vel, the implemented in collaboration International Cooperative Alliance-Africa (ICA-Africa), the Federation of Cooperatives (TFC), Tanzania Mozambican Association for the Promotion of Modern Cooperatives (AMPCM), Moshi Co-operative University (MoCU), and the Catholic University of Mozambique.
