# Call for Papers 16<sup>th</sup> AFRICA REGIONAL ASSEMBLY AND CONFERENCE

THEME: Cooperatives for a Sustainable Africa

14<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2023

ICA-Africa and its members in Nigeria are hosting the 16<sup>th</sup> Africa Regional Assembly and Conference which will be held from 14<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2023 at the Abuja Continental Hotel in Abuja – Nigeria. The theme of the 2023 regional conference is: *Cooperatives for a Sustainable Africa*.

The Africa Regional Conference on Cooperatives aims to bring together key stakeholders, experts, practitioners, and policymakers from across Africa to explore the significant role of cooperatives in promoting sustainable development on the continent. This forum seeks to create a platform for knowledge exchange, collaboration, and innovative solutions to address Africa's socio-economic and environmental challenges through the cooperative movement.

This call for papers pertains to the thematic focus of "Cooperatives for a Sustainable Africa" that underscore the pivotal role cooperatives play in advancing sustainable livelihoods, fostering development, promoting peace, and facilitating partnerships and collaborations among various stakeholders for the purpose of sustainable development across the African continent.

Another crucial facet of the call is centered around **the innovative solutions that cooperatives deploy to facilitate peace and development, thereby fostering a sustainable Africa.** This subtheme prompts researchers to delve into the creative approaches and strategies employed by cooperatives to mitigate conflicts, alleviate social tensions, and contribute to overall stability. The exploration of such innovative practices may encompass conflict resolution mechanisms, social inclusion initiatives, and the use of cooperative structures as conduits for addressing pressing social challenges.

Furthermore, the call highlights **the imperative of fostering partnerships and collaborations between cooperatives, governments, civil society, and international development agencies to bolster sustainable development efforts in Africa**. This subtheme underscores the significance of a multistakeholder approach in achieving holistic and enduring progress. Authors are encouraged to investigate successful models of collaboration, the challenges and opportunities inherent in such partnerships, and the role of policy frameworks in facilitating cooperative engagement with governmental and nongovernmental entities.

Interested authors should submit their abstracts by **25<sup>th</sup> September**, **2023** at <u>pm@icaafrica.coop</u>; copy to <u>erickobongo@icaafrica.coop</u>; mentioning as the email's subject "ICA-Africa Regional Conference Abstract Submission."

Authors of abstracts of papers addressing the theme of the conference will be selected and requested to submit full papers to be considered for presentation. Priority will be given to policy-and-solution oriented papers. Young researchers, academia and practitioners are encouraged to submit their abstracts. One key objective of the conference being to share knowledge that enables Cooperatives and other stakeholders in Africa to engage effectively in national, regional and international cooperation. ## **Review Process:**

Papers received will be peer reviewed through a blind review process by the co-organizing institutions. The papers will be subjected to plagiarism check, and those which meet accepted standards will be accepted for presentation.

#### **Sponsorship:**

Authors are expected to cover their travel, accommodation and daily subsistence costs. Presenters will be exempted from paying the conference fee. It is expected that where a paper is jointly written by a team of authors, only one author will attend the Conference tomake a presentation on behalf of the other authors.

#### **Abstract guidelines**

The following should be included in the abstract: Title, name and affiliation of the author(s); contact of corresponding author; a brief background/context and problem; objectives; theoretical anchorage/conceptual framework; methodology; results; conclusions; and recommendations. Flexibility will be excised to provide for abstracts for papers from different approaches and disciplines. The abstract, which should have a maximum of 300 words, should be submitted in English, in New Times Roman, italicized, single spacing with 3-5 keywords in bold at the bottom of the abstract.
